





Maristhill Becoming Regional Test Site For CNAs

Thanks to a grant from the Catholic Health Foundation, Maristhill Nursing and Rehabilitation Center is well on its way to becoming a regional test site for Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) in the greater Boston area. Even prior to the pandemic, there was a shortage of healthcare workers, and the delay in CNA certification in the greater Boston area exacerbated the issue.

One step in our process of being a testing site involves the purchase of training manikins, which are a unique and important learning tool because they display neurological and physical symptoms and feature automatic drug recognition. They help instructors safely develop and practice the assessment and treatment skills essential to delivering quality care.

These new manikins will be invaluable in preparing students for CNA certification, expanding testing opportunities, and enhancing our ability to attract new CNAs to our Maristhill family.
